"Regulatory Paralysis Act" Threatens to Weaken Nation's Primary Health, Safety and Environmental Laws

Coalition for Sensible Safeguards Statement on the Regulatory Accountability Act, Reintroduced in Congress on Thursday (S. 1029 / H.R. 2122)

The Regulatory Accountability Act (RAA) would weaken dozens of laws that protect the environment, public health, workplace safety and consumer rights. It would override and weaken the Clean Air Act, Consumer Product Safety Act and Food Safety Modernization Act. The bill is designed to undermine public protections, not improve them.

The RAA would paralyze the implementation of current protective laws and require federal agencies to prioritize protecting corporate interests over protecting the health and safety of American workers and families.

While federal agencies currently take years to issue health and safety standards, this bill would make that process even longer. It would allow big business lobbyists to second-guess the work of respected scientists through legal challenges, sparking a wave of litigation that would add more costs and delays to the rulemaking process, potentially putting the lives, health and safety of millions of Americans at risk.

Congress should focus its efforts on finding ways to ensure federal agencies enforce the laws designed to protect our food supply, water, air quality and financial security, and stop trying to weaken the nation's system of regulatory safeguards.
